Risk mitigation protocol in the context of Covid-19 for participants of the IWAS Wheelchair Fencing World Cup Brazil 2022- Update on April 02, 2022

1. Requirements for Entrants Before the Competition

1.1. Travel organization

- Check all requirements, conditions and exemptions mentioned in the invitation letter published on the CBE – Brazilian Fencing Confederation website.
- Check airline requirements.
- Plan more time to travel than usual. It is everyone's responsibility to plan the trip so that they can
 undergo all necessary Covid-19 tests before traveling and in the host country.
- Take the necessary tests to enter the host country. These tests are the responsibility of the participants.

1.2. Administrative obligations

- Read and respect the COVID-19 and Safety Plan.
- Read and respect the rules communicated by the host organizers.

1.3. Accommodation

- It is recommended to book single rooms for participants. This is to prevent all its occupants from having to be quarantined and eliminated from competition, due to a positive result for Covid-19.
- Any meeting in hotel rooms should be avoided.
- If the hotel is within walking distance of the event venue, participants must refrain from traveling to other locations.

1.4. Equipment

Equipment (bags, masks, gloves, and weapons, etc.) must be disinfected by the fencers before competition.

2. Tests required by ANVISA - Brazilian National Health Agency - for entry into Brazil -[updated April 1, 2022]

Foreign and Brazilian travelers abroad must present to the airline responsible for the flight, before boarding:

2.1. proof of vaccination, printed or electronically

A traveler who has completed the primary vaccination schedule at least fourteen days before the date of departure is considered to have been fully vaccinated, provided that:

 immunizing agents approved by Anvisa, the World Health Organization or the authorities of the country where the traveler was immunized are used; and



- o Vaccination vouchers contain, at least, the name of the traveler and the following vaccination data:
 - a. The trade name or manufacturer's name;
 - b. Lot(s) number(s) of the applied dose(s); and
 - c. Date(s) of application of the dose(s).
- Vaccination vouchers in which the data provided above are available exclusively in QR-CODE format or in any other coded language will not be accepted.
- Sars-Cov-2 (covid-19) recovery certificates will not be accepted in lieu of proof of complete vaccination. Antigen test (performed within 24 hours prior to departure); or
- RT-PCR laboratory test (performed within 72 hours prior to departure).
- Documents issued abroad must be presented in Portuguese, Spanish or English. Tests required by ANVISA - Brazilian National Health Agency - for entry into Brazil

3. Requirements for Participants During the Competition

3.1. Vaccination tests and proof

All participants in the competition – athletes, coaches, referees, delegates, etc. must present:

3.2. proof of vaccination

The application of the last dose or single dose must have occurred at least 14 days before the date of departure

3.3. competition audience

- Must present antigen test performed within 24 hours prior to the start of the competition or TR-PCR test carried out within 72 hours before the start of the competition OR
- Present proof of vaccination, and the application of the last dose or single dose must have occurred, at least, 14 days before the competition start date.

4. Recommended Sanitary Measures

- Consult a doctor in case of symptoms
- Fencing masks, gloves and weapons must be disinfected by fencers before the Competition
- It is not allowed to share equipment with another participant.
- Keep a sanitary distance of 1.5 meters
- The use of face masks is recommended at all times, except during training, during competitions, during meals and in open environments with good air ventilation.
- Referees must use hand sanitizer before and after each bout.
- Competition doctor and medical staff must wear face masks and gloves.
- During rest periods, it is recommended that all persons in the fencing rink area keep a distance of 1.5 meters from the fencer(s).
- Participants must bring their own water bottle and must not share it with anyone.
- Compliance with any additional measures proposed by IWAS, CBE or local regulations is mandatory.

5. Impacted rules and practices



- The fencers' handshake at the end of the bout is replaced by a salute.
- Screaming after a marked ring is suspended until further notice.
- Hugs, kisses or congratulatory handshakes are suspended until further notice.
- We recommend that participants, when sitting in the stands while preparing for the competition, keep the sanitary distance of 1.5m.

6. Presentation and Award Ceremonies

- It is recommended that during the presentation of fencers and presentations on the track and delivery of medals distance, keep to 1.5 meters.
- Medals and gifts given to fencers on a cushion or tray and fencers must pick them up.
- Trays must be disinfected after each ceremony.

7. Penalties

Event accredited by the exclusion of the protocol or refusal in compliance with the Covid-19 protocol.
