World Abilitysport

IC	In Competition	Testing conducted 12 hours prior and during competition.
OOC	Out of competition	Testing conducted at any time outside a competition or sporting event.
AAF	Adverse Analytical Finding	A report from a laboratory or other WADA approved testing entities that identifies in a specimen the presence of a prohibited substance or its metabolites or markers, or evidence of the use of a prohibited method.
ATF	Atypical Finding	A report from a laboratory or other WADA approved entity which requires further investigation by the International Standard for Laboratories or related Technical Documents prior to the determination of an Adverse Analytical Finding.
ADRV	Anti-Doping Rule Violation	An AAF or ATF, or any other investigation that is not supported by a TUE or where no apparent departure of the applicable International Standards is delivered.
TUE	Therapeutic Use Exemption	Requesting due medical needs to use a prohibited Substance
